## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

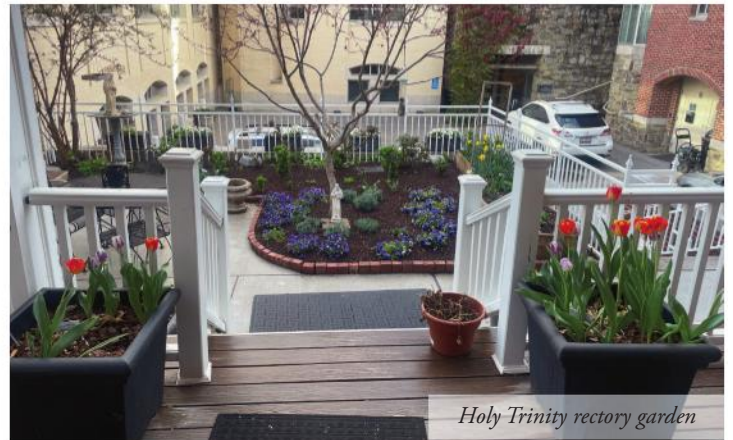
*Happy Easter!*

*Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?"*

*She thought it was the gardener... (John 20:15)*

Happy Easter! I often find it curious that Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene in a garden, seemingly dressed up as a gardener. Some biblical commentators note that the writer of John's Gospel in relating the story is developing a parallel between the Creation story of Genesis and the New Creation story of the Resurrected Jesus.

My curiosity also derives from my hobby of fiddling around gardens. I have often had the joy of helping our pre-kindergarten children with their school playground gardens. Watching the children plant bulbs and seedlings in the garden's rich soil prompts feelings of hope. Such a hope is well expressed in a phrase carved on a bench at the entrance to our Chapel garden: "To plant a garden is to believe in tomorrow."

In a sense, a parish is like a garden. The devotions, disciplines, and rituals of the Lenten Liturgical Season served to plant spiritual seeds for the soils of our souls. Here at Holy Trinity, this past Lenten season was certainly blessed with a wide variety of inspirational events. Perhaps you attended one of the series of Friday evening suppers and stations of the cross or participated in the Lenten retreat. Certainly, one of the highlights was the performance of the Reston Chorale featuring members of the Holy Trinity Choirs as they presented Gabriel Fauré's Requiem. These and many other events enabled parishioners to plant seeds of spirituality in the soils of their Lenten souls.

Our local Jesuit Community recently met with our Provincial, Father Joseph O'Keefe, about the challenges we

face as Jesuits. The USA East Province extends from Maine to Georgia, sponsoring 15 parishes, 11 colleges and universities, 12 high schools, 2 retreat houses, 3 elementary schools, and several other apostolates. We are one of those parishes and one of those elementary schools. Our Province has a total of 534 Jesuits, but with an average age of 73!

As you can imagine, each of our institutions is being challenged by our diminishing numbers. Fortunately, the Province continues to be committed to Holy Trinity by assigning four of us, Fathers Dennis, Earl, Kelley and me.

Looking ahead with Easter hope, our new Archbishop, Cardinal McElroy, will begin meeting with each of the Archdiocesan pastors at the end of the month. At separate meetings, he will also meet with three parishioners from each parish. On Thursday, April 24 I will meet with him for half an hour, while our three parishioners will meet with him on Saturday, April 26. The three Holy Trinity parishioners are Gail Louis (Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council), Frank Butler (Parish Council member and a national Catholic leader) and Cristina Torres (a Holy Trinity School parent and an active member of the Social Justice Committee).

Having met Fr. O'Keefe last month, Cardinal McElroy is familiar with the diminishing number of Jesuits. In my meeting with him, however, I intend to highlight other numbers, viz. those pertaining to Holy Trinity Parish. It will be consoling to convey to him how many Holy Trinity parishioners are engaged in volunteer ministries. Here are some of the numbers, broadly speaking:

- 450 parishioners are involved in the Liturgical ministry,
- Over 225 men and women are actively engaged each month in the regular work of the Social Justice ministry,
- Some 200 volunteers assist with Faith Formation for adults, youth, and children, and
- The Ignatian Spirituality ministry has 80 volunteers

I will also happily report to the Archbishop that, thanks to our dynamic Order of Christian Initiation Program, 17 people were baptized at the Easter Vigil!

Finally, during this Jubilee Year, when we look to tomorrow as pilgrims of hope, may the seeds of spirituality planted in the soils of Lent come to fruition in our Easter souls and bring forth gardens of hope.

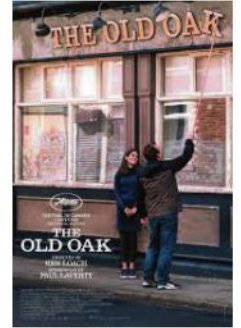

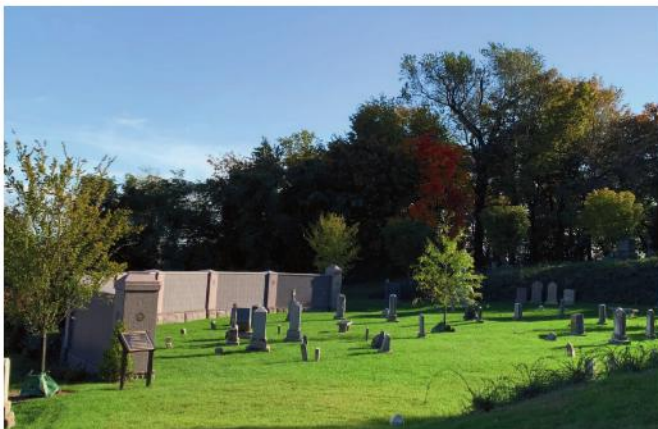

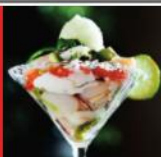
