10 New Homes for Haiti

Holy Trinity began a relationship with St. Jean Baptiste, Ansdeno, Haiti in 2010. In 2016, we started working with Food for the Poor (FFTP), a large non profit organization, after a hurricane in 2016 destroyed much of the area in Haiti where our sister parish is located.

Since then, we have supported a number of projects managed by them, including the construction of 31 new homes, a new chapel, a new parish center, and a sanitation block for the school, and the installation of 2 wells. FFTP also donates food every year for the school lunch program.

Each year, we support a special project requested by our Haitian sister parish. This year, they have requested our assistance in building 10 additional new homes. There is a tremendous need for decent housing in Haiti.

Many families live in makeshift shelters constructed from rusting metal sheets and rotting wood. These homes lack water, electricity, and indoor plumbing. Access to clean water is limited in our sister parish community. Many women and children walk long distances every day to collect water from natural sources or wells.



Having a roof over our heads, a bathroom for safe hygiene, and access to water in our own homes are all necessities we take for granted. Many people in our sister parish community have never had a safe, well-built structure to live in, let alone easy access to water. Having a bathroom inside the home reduces the risk of disease transmission, which is common in areas with inadequate sanitation.

The new two-bedroom homes will have a water cistern, a bathroom, a kitchen, a living room, solar electricity and furniture. An engineer ensures that all homes are built to code.

Here is what two mothers said after receiving their new homes:

- Rose Marie: "I thank God and everyone for this new house. I am now sleeping under a roof. I live in the home with my kids and husband. We sleep and wake up well. We send a big thank you for everything you've done for us."
- Lina: "If it wasn't for this help I would be living on the street. We were homeless because my house burned down. We thank God for our new house. We sleep and wake up well. I live with my son and we are very happy in our new home."



After these next 10 homes are built, Holy Trinity will have helped provide 41 families with new homes at our sister parish.

The cost of building one home is \$13,000. Approximately \$40,000 has been raised so far for this project. If you can help us reach our goal, please scan the QR code at right.

PRAYER FOR THE ELECTION OF A NEW POPE

WATER OF LIFE: FRESH WATERS AND CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

This presentation by Dr. Christiana Zenner, Associate Professor of Theology, Science, and Ethics at Fordham University, will explore how fresh waters flow in the contemporary world, with a particular focus on contemporary hydrology, political geography, and Catholic Social Teaching.

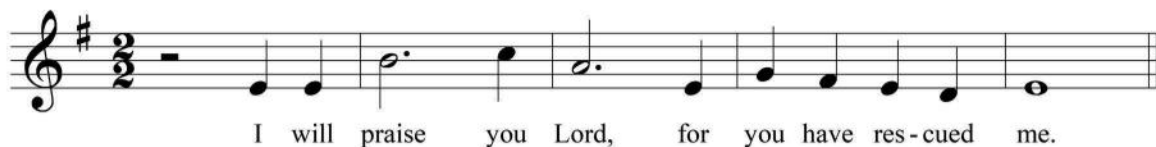

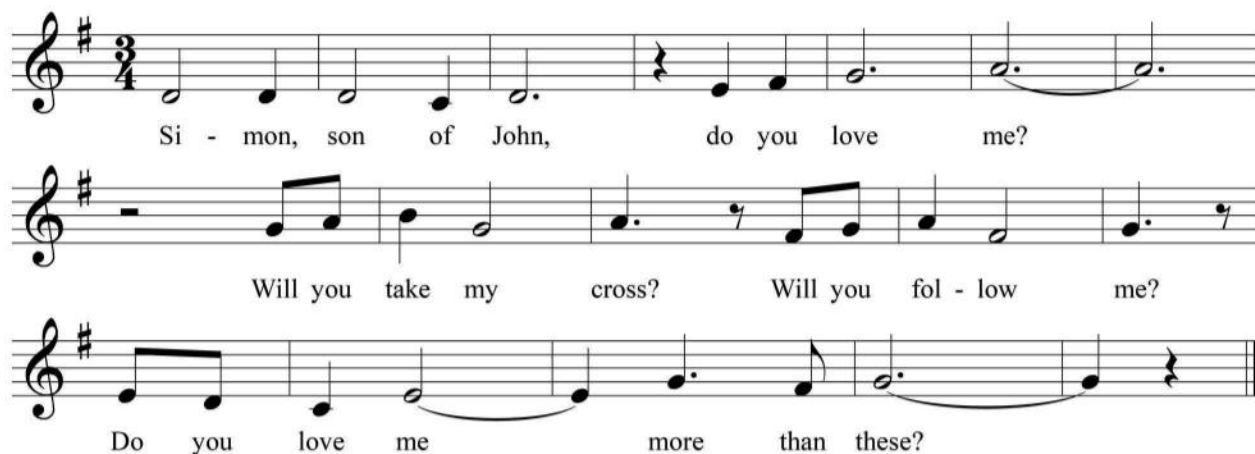

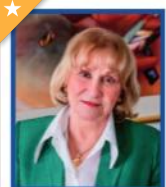
