The Youth Are Called To Holiness

On April 27, 39 High School and 8th grade students gathered in the Neale Room for an annual joint 8th grade/ High School youth group meeting. This year, it was not only an opportunity for the 8th graders to get a taste of what a youth group would be like for them in the years to come, it was also an opportunity to gather during the Jubilee of Teenagers that took place in Rome April 26-27.

Originally, this Jubilee year celebration was centered around the canonization of Bl. Carlo Acutis - the first Millennial Saint - and it ended up focusing on the life of Pope Francis. While the pure focus of the weekend changed, it did allow many young people who were already traveling to Rome to be present at this historic time, and I do not think Pope Francis would have it any other way.

Always an advocate for young people, Pope Francis was vocal on how he viewed young people as he talked about extensively on in his exhortation, Christus Vivit ("Christ is Alive"). Pope Francis believed young people are to be co-responsible in ministry and protagonists in their own journey. As a Church, we all need young people engaged, as they are essential to keep us young, vitalized, and pure. Pope Francis also often emphasized, as in Gaudete et



Exsultate ("Rejoice and Be Glad"), that we are all called to holiness, even the young.

This path to holiness can often be difficult and presents its own unique set of challenges and struggles. My own path includes many struggles, including the time as a youth into college. At one point, I no longer had faith and would attend church out of obligation. I just went through the motions of going without feeling anything. Little did I

know, even that place of desolation, the Holy Spirit was still working in me and in those around me.

Not too long afterward through a period of illness, I would remember how my church community was there for me and in my heart. I began to fully understand that this is how Christ lives in people, and I wanted to be like them in living for Christ. In this dark time, I decided to turn to my faith and dedicate myself to being not only a person who just believed, but a disciple who would work for others who were also in need. The area that called me the most was ministering to young people.

My journey into youth ministry was not a solitary one. There were people in my life and my parish who accompanied me along the way. Sometimes that included providing wisdom, extending the invitation to be a part of ministries, pushing me forward or just simply being there to listen, learn, and enjoy each other's company. All had a place in my life to help get me where I am today.

We all must look at how we can accompany young people on their path to holiness. Many believe and fear that they are not equipped to accompany young people but the main skill we all need is the ability to listen: to their concerns, worries, expectations, joys, and accomplishments and be in relationship with them. While we may need help in being better listeners, we all have the ability to listen and we must use it to build relationships needed in a spirit-filled community.

I extend the invitation to all adults (and even other young people!) to become relational ministers: people who are actively able to listen to our young people inside and outside of the Church walls. Go to where they are and practice synodality with our youngest members. We are forming a cohort that will regularly meet to talk about and work on skills to be better listeners. We need more people to be "next-door Saints" and help accompany our young people to know that they, too, can be like Bl. Carlo Acutis and can accomplish great things.

PRAYER FOR THE ELECTION OF A NEW POPE

Pope Francis' funeral on Saturday, April 26 marked the beginning of the *Novemdiales*, an ancient tradition of nine days of mourning. This period ended on Sunday, May 4.

After the conclusion of the *Novemdiales*, the College of Cardinals were set to meet in the Conclave to select the new Pope, beginning on Wednesday, May 7.

- Our latest compost report notes that our efforts have saved 14 tons of waste from going to the landfill.
- The solar panels installed on the Upper and Lower School roofs are online, and designed to provide over 1,100 kWh/kW of renewable power each year.
