2025 Tithe Program Grants Announced

From the Social Justice Ministry

Holy Trinity's Tithe Grant program (ten percent of parishioners' regular collections) seeks to address root causes of social justice issues both locally and within the global community. This concrete and ongoing commitment to social justice is a priority among Holy Trinity parishioners and its careful and transparent distribution is an important responsibility of the Social Justice Committee.

The amount available this year from the pledge and general/holiday offerings is \$433,000. Father Gillespie and the committee agreed to supplement the total with \$117,000 from the Alms/Community Fund, bringing the total funds available to \$550,000.

The large grant focus for 2025 is on unaccompanied minors. The Washington, DC metro area resettles per capita more unaccompanied children than any other region in the country. We received 16 submissions. The committee opted to award grants totaling \$80,000 to two organizations: Restoration Immigration Legal Aid (\$50,000) and the Young Center (\$30,000).

In addition to the large grant theme, each year the committee awards small grants (\$5,000 - \$20,000) to organizations addressing environmental justice, racial justice, refugees/migration, returning citizens, homelessness, and youth.



The committee is guided by the Apostolic Preferences: Showing the Way to God; Walking with the Excluded; Journeying with Youth; and Care for Our Common Home. We also award grants to our sister parishes.

The committee reviewed 82 small grant requests. In addition to the large grants, we are excited to award small grants to 32 organizations - a total of 11 new organizations received grants across all categories. A snapshot of funding is provided at trinity.org/social-justice/tithe/.

wraparound services to low-income households in Ward 1 of Washington, DC. This award will support their critical work with citizens returning from incarceration through Jubilee Farms, a new and innovative component of their Reentry Program.

Don Bosco Cristo Rey High School

Don Bosco Cristo Rey High School and Corporate Work Study Program provides a college- and career-preparatory education in the Catholic tradition specifically to students from under-resourced communities. This award will support the Mental Health & Counseling Program, enabling students to thrive amidst widespread mental health and socioeconomic inequalities for the '25-'26 school year.

College Tracks

Since their founding 20+ years ago, the mission of College Tracks has remained unchanged- "to empower first-generation-to-college students and students from immigrant and low-income households in Montgomery County, MD by helping them bridge systemic opportunity gaps with enough support to go to and through postsecondary education and on a career pathway." The grant will support their College Access program in serving 1,100 high school students, and their College Success program in serving 550 postsecondary students.

Literacy Lab *New!*

The Literacy Lab's mission is to provide Pre K students - in communities experiencing racial and/or economic inequities - with evidence-based, culturally responsive literacy instruction. The grant will sponsor the recruitment, training and placement of 15-20 Leading Men Fellows in Washington, DC classrooms during the 2025-26 school year.

N Street Village

N Street Village supports women experiencing homelessness in Washington, DC. The award supports the Senior Transitional Program, a nine-month

residency for older women who have experienced long-term homelessness, moving 25 women toward stable housing.

Think Peace *New!*

The Coalition of Large Tribes unanimously adopted Resolution #01-2024 highlighting the urgent needs of mental health services for Indigenous peoples. Some Indigenous nations have only one therapist for 100,000 people. The grant awarded to Think Peace will create a foundational workshop to provide indigenous mental health and psychosocial support practitioners to indigenous communities in Maryland and Virginia

Volare

Formerly Network for Victim Recovery of DC, Volare has provided over 12,000 survivors of crime in the District with free, trauma-informed advocacy, therapeutic, and legal services. The award will fund therapeutic mental health services for youth survivors of violence.

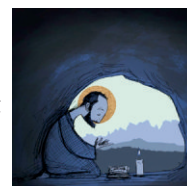

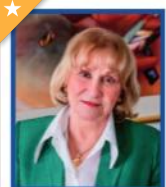
