FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK by Fr. C. Kevin Gillespie, S.J.



PEACE THROUGH THE ARTS

Entering the vast interior of Chartres Cathedral last month, I was enveloped by its history. Though the ancient stone now gleams brighter than before thanks to a massive restoration project, the famous stained-glass windows still cast their impossibly deep blues and reds across the timeless space.

I visited Chartres to attend a concert of sacred music by The Vocal Five, students from the Duke Ellington School for the Arts whose trip to France was sponsored by the generosity of Holy Trinity parishioners.

These five young women – Lila Benavente, Layla Bunch, Eva Quiroz, Sylvie Raich, and Krithi Santhanam – were like musical ambassadors of the United States. The five performed at UNESCO (the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) headquarters in Paris and later held a concert before an audience of some 400 under the soaring vaults of Chartres Cathedral.

Holy Trinity's sponsorship of this trip developed out of our concert series, which over the last few years has opened

our doors to the broader community – inviting those who are seeking spiritual consolation during a time in which so many suffer from a poverty of the spirit.

This is part of a long Jesuit tradition of embracing the arts as a means of enriching spirituality, education, and its mission. Originating from the vision of St. Ignatius Loyola in the 16th century, the Society of Jesus has integrated the arts into its educational and spiritual practices as powerful means of expression, contemplation, and communication.

Music, in particular, serves as a vibrant thread woven through the tapestry of Jesuit life. It resonates deeply with Ignatian spirituality, which encourages finding God in all things and through all experiences. This approach invites Jesuits and their collaborators to engage with music not merely as entertainment but as a conduit for encountering the divine and expressing faith.

Jesuit schools and universities around the world embrace music as an essential component of education. It nurtures creativity, discipline, and aesthetic sensitivity among students, echoing Ignatius's emphasis on developing the whole person. Through choirs, orchestras, and music programs, students learn to appreciate diverse cultural expressions, fostering an inclusive and harmonious community.

Moreover, music plays a pivotal role in Jesuit worship and prayer. Liturgical music enriches spiritual practices, enhancing the communal experience of Masses, retreats, and other sacred rituals. Did you know that in 1768, a Jesuit priest in Vienna commissioned a 12-year-old Mozart to compose a Mass for the consecration of a new orphanage church, the Waisenhauskirche?

Whether through chant, polyphonic compositions, or contemporary hymns, music heightens the sacred atmosphere, inviting participants to enter into deeper prayer and reflection.


Jesuit parishes also leverage music to engage parishioners and the broader community. Concerts, musical performances, and cultural events serve as platforms for dialogue, social justice advocacy, and spiritual outreach.

As we experienced in France last month, music can serve as a universal language that transcends barriers, fostering understanding and solidarity among diverse populations. At the conclusion of the concert at Chartres, the audience was invited to join in the singing of *Dona Nobis Pacem*. Hundreds of voices joined in that ancient space for a brief moment, Catholic and non-Catholic, French and non-French, pilgrims and tourists.

In the realm of mission and social justice, the arts, including music, become powerful tools for advocacy and transformation. Jesuits and their collaborators use music to amplify voices of marginalized communities, advocate for peace and reconciliation, and inspire action towards justice. Through artistic expression, Jesuits ignite hearts and minds to work toward a more just and humane world.

The arts are not mere embellishments within the Jesuit tradition but integral expressions of its spirituality, education, and mission. They embody Ignatian values of contemplation in action, finding God in all things, and fostering a faith that promotes justice. Through music, Jesuits and their collaborators continue to inspire, educate, and transform lives, embodying the dynamic and inclusive spirit of Ignatian spirituality in a world hungering for beauty, harmony, and meaning.
