Advent: Holy Waiting

Every year, the season of Advent invites us to slow down and remember that there is hope. It's a quiet counterpoint to the noisy rush of December. It's a time to pay attention. We remember that God loves us so much that he became one of us so that we might have eternal life.

This is a season of *holy waiting*. The season begins with the promise of Christ's coming again. This eschatological hope, that is so easily forgotten, reminds us that history is moving toward God's fullness. Christ is not only the one who came but also the one who is coming. Advent's beauty lies in holding both simultaneously, looking back in celebration and forward in expectation. This two-fold dimension of Advent calls us to active waiting working for justice, peace, and reconciliation now.

Our liturgy embodies these two dimensions. Isaiah's prophecies remind us of a people longing for light. John the Baptist calls us to repentance and readiness. And in the final days before Christmas, our attention turns to Mary the young woman of Nazareth whose courageous "yes" made God's presence tangible in the world. Pay attention to the colors and the visual cues of the season. Reflect upon the texts that we sing, the feelings that our music evokes, the smells in the air, and the shortness of the daylight.



The liturgical colors express the joyful hope of the season. The deep violet, much like the color of the winter sky at the moments just before daybreak, reminds us that the Christ light is not far away. On the Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday, the color rose enters the liturgy. The Latin word *gaudete* means rejoice. This day doesn't replace the *holy waiting* but hints at the light breaking through the darkness and of the joy rising within the longing.

The melodies and sung texts of Advent carry both longing and promise. We will sing “longing for light, we wait in darkness” and “comfort, comfort my people, who sit in darkness.” We cry out the ancient Aramaic phrase “Maranatha” which translates “Our Lord, come!” or “Our Lord has come!”

On the Third Sunday, we begin our liturgy with “Rejoice” and then continue during the Communion Procession with the well-known “O Come, O Come Emmanuel” that draws directly from the ancient “O Antiphons.” Each verse calling on Christ by a different biblical title from Hebrew Scripture: Wisdom, Lord, Root of Jesse, Key of David, Dayspring, King of the Nations, and God-with-us.

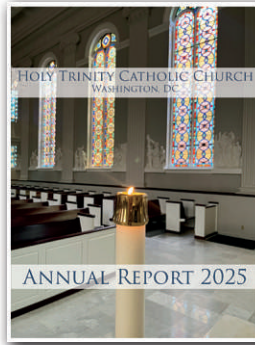
In all of this, Mary is our model. She proclaims the God who “casts down the mighty from their thrones and lifts up the lowly.” Her song is prophecy and so when we sing those words this Advent, we join in her work of transforming the world. Her openness to God’s call is courageous. She trusts that love can take flesh through her. We are called to follow her example and to let God’s compassion be born through our lives, our work, and our decisions.

Here are a few ways to enter this holy season more deeply:

- Light the Advent wreath at home each Sunday.
- Pray the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary meditating on Mary’s “yes.”
- Reflect each night on the question: “Where did I notice God being born today?”
- Pray and reflect on the ancient O Antiphons, one each day, from December 17–23.
- Serve a meal for the homeless or support a shelter.

In these daily acts, our waiting becomes *holy waiting*. As we approach the darkest days of the year, hold on to the hope of our faith that the light of Christ has entered the world and that Christ’s light is expanding. Our *holy waiting* becomes the small flame that whispers of God’s expanding light.

Symbols

Liturgical symbols make spiritual realities perceptible to the senses. Incense honors the mystery of Christ. Ashes carry the reminder to repent in a way that words alone cannot. A fire in the darkness speaks to us of Christ's resurrection, his victory over death. The sacraments are our most powerful symbols. Here, the incarnation is still happening, through earthly things, through human hands and human voices. Water is poured over the body, and the whole person is made clean. Bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, and we in turn become what we receive. When we allow the symbols to become part of us and each other, God is present to us.
