This was also a year of growth for our team. We were blessed to welcome **Allie Carter** as our new Campaign Manager, and her immediate impact has already strengthened our relationship-building goal. Allie brings focus, warmth, and exceptional attention to detail, and she has helped us deepen our connections with parishioners in ways that will support our mission for years to come. Allie and Luis are such talented, committed colleagues.

Looking forward, **2026 will be a year defined by vision and outreach**, particularly as we continue to lay the groundwork for our capital campaign, Lighting the Way. This campaign is an opportunity to strengthen our spaces, invest in long-term mission priorities, and ensure that Holy Trinity remains a beacon of American Catholic spirituality for decades to come.

Thanks to early leadership commitments, we have already **surpassed \$1 million** in pledges and payments. That remarkable early momentum reflects the deep love parishioners have for Holy Trinity. We will increase our outreach in the new year, and we appreciate your patience and prayers as we build toward a broader, more inclusive outreach.

As we enter 2026, we look forward to meeting more parishioners and sharing how our annual pledge campaign sustains the daily work, while our capital campaign will propel Holy Trinity into the future. 


