FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A STRONG AND GRACE-FILLED VOICE

2025 certainly was a challenging year. Personally, it was a year when problems with my vocal cords required an operation and the intervention of weekly visits to a voice therapist. These experiences have led me to appreciate the significance of one's voice, both physically and metaphorically. Indeed, the word "voice" when used metaphorically serves to describe the major themes and the tones of the year 2025, a year when the Catholic Church celebrated a Jubilee Year with the theme *Pilgrims of Hope*.

Certainly, our local area experienced a year of change—socio-economic, political, and ecclesiastical. In this respect, you might say that the plethora of transitions can be described as changes in voice—a deep re-tuning of how the Church speaks, listens, and sings its faith into the life

of the city. Fittingly, this unfolding took place during the Jubilee Year. A Jubilee is never merely about words spoken; it is about voices reclaimed, debts released, relationships restored, and a people set once again on the road together.

In the spring, there was a profound hush as the voice of Pope Francis fell silent in death. His passing brought the sudden absence of a familiar tone that had taught the Church to speak more softly to those on the margins and more boldly about compassion, inclusion, and hope.

Out of that silence came a new voice with the election of Pope Leo XIV. Not a replacement of Francis' voice, but a continuation with a distinct timbre—drawing from the same Gospel melody while articulating it in new accents. Pope Leo XIV's early words and his declaration to continue Pope Francis's synodal pronouncements suggested a commitment to communion, clarity, and courage: a voice willing to harmonize tradition with modern pastoral instincts. The election of Cardinal Robert Prevost signaled that the global Church would not retreat into nostalgia or fear, but continue to speak confidently to a complex, pluralistic society.

Closer to home, the Archdiocese of Washington also experienced a shift in voice. The retirement of Cardinal Wilton Gregory marked the conclusion of a pastoral chapter characterized by steadiness, dignity, and a careful attentiveness to justice and reconciliation. His leadership had been a measured, calming voice in moments of turbulence, encouraging dialogue and pastoral sensitivity. Cardinal Gregory was especially supportive of our parish's outreach to marginalized communities such as LBGTQIA+.

With the installation of Cardinal Robert McElroy, a new voice came to the Archdiocese—one clearly attuned to the call of synodality, social engagement, and intellectual depth. Cardinal McElroy's voice has brought a renewed emphasis on listening, moral discernment, and the Church's responsibility to engage the political and cultural realities of Washington with both humility and conviction.

Recently I attended an Archdiocesan meeting in which the Cardinal spoke of having listened to and spoken with more than 400 parishioners and pastors. Through this synodal-like process, the Cardinal was able to develop a strategic plan for the Archdiocese.

Cardinal McElroy's voice that does not seek to dominate the conversation, but to deepen it, inviting the local Church to speak credibly because it first listens carefully. His recent actions and statements on behalf of migrants complement our parish efforts on their behalf. Certainly, our Social Justice outreach to refugees and asylum seekers and the many programs supported through parish tithing continue to be a place where many voices are welcomed.

Here at Holy Trinity Parish, the Church's ecclesial shifts found concrete expression in discussions about the Synod Report. Here, the metaphor of voice became deeply personal and communal as parishioners, especially through the Parish Pastoral Council, were invited not simply to hear Church teaching, but to lend their own voices to the life of the Church—through dialogue, shared discernment, and renewed participation in mission.

The many liturgical activities, formation programs, and Ignatian spirituality groups of our parish became instruments where many voices were welcomed, where the tone of parish life emphasized accompaniment

over instruction alone, and where occasions for listening itself were recognized as sacred movements.

Taken together, 2025 was a year in which we here at Holy Trinity Parish learned again that its most faithful voice is not a solo performance. Indeed, like a harmonious choir, our listening and speaking are diverse, sometimes tentative, occasionally dissonant, yet capable of profound harmony when rooted in the Gospel. In a region shaped by power and rhetoric, the Church's changing voice offered something different: a voice formed by memory and hope, grief and promise, silence and song. In this respect our various parish groups listened to voices of those grieving the death of a loved one or the sudden loss of job, especially those who served our nation in federal positions.

As pastor of Holy Trinity Parish, I hear 2025 as a strong and grace-filled voice—one shaped by the generosity of our parishioners, by prayers spoken and lived, and by countless acts of service that gave sound to our Jubilee calling as Pilgrims of Hope. That voice echoes with gratitude for what has been sung, spoken, and whispered in faith this past year. As we turn toward 2026, I listen for a new voice still forming among us—one marked by hope, courage, and attentiveness to the Spirit—inviting us to speak the Gospel with renewed clarity, compassion, and joy in the year ahead.

On behalf of our parish staff and my fellow Jesuits, Frs. Campbell, Dennis, Earl and Kelley, may the voices of you and yours this Christmas be joyful and hopeful throughout 2026!






NOW HIRING: ASSISTANT TO FACILITIES MANAGER
