My initial immersion into writing for our Holy Trinity Church bulletin was shortly after I first arrived, in September 2024. I was asked to draw up a bio about myself and share it with the parish community, which I gladly did.

I approach you this time around, not to speak about myself; rather, I would like to reflect on my time at Holy Trinity, as I approach my two-year anniversary in a few months.

I deeply appreciate being able to live in the parish rectory. Frs. Earl and Gillespie are exceedingly easy Jesuits with whom to live and, while we each have our little human peculiarities, we get along beautifully. (Frs. Campbell and Kelley reside at Wolfington Hall on the Georgetown campus.) I am especially appreciative to be able to live 'on-site,' as I often move back and forth between the rectory and parish center, which is incredibly convenient. I am also appreciative of the spacious house in which we live and our ability to live together, yet also have space to pray, read, write and meet with others for counseling or marriage preparation.

It may sound like a cliché, but what I love best about being a Jesuit priest at Holy Trinity are the people - both parishioners and visitors to Holy Trinity. You make our



five Jesuits feel both very appreciated and loved. And we feel very similarly about you. I know my Jesuit brothers work diligently on their homilies for daily and Sunday Masses ... we take all Sacramental duties to heart ... and we try our best to make Holy Trinity Parish a welcoming home for all.

I cannot imagine a church staff that is more talented or harder working than our staff at Holy Trinity. The liturgies, sacred music, church environment, grade school, social justice efforts, attention to Ignatian Spirituality and Spirituality Direction, lay preaching, fund-raising for *continued on page 2*
