FEBRUARY: THE MONTH OF LOVE - FINDING PEACE IN CHRIST

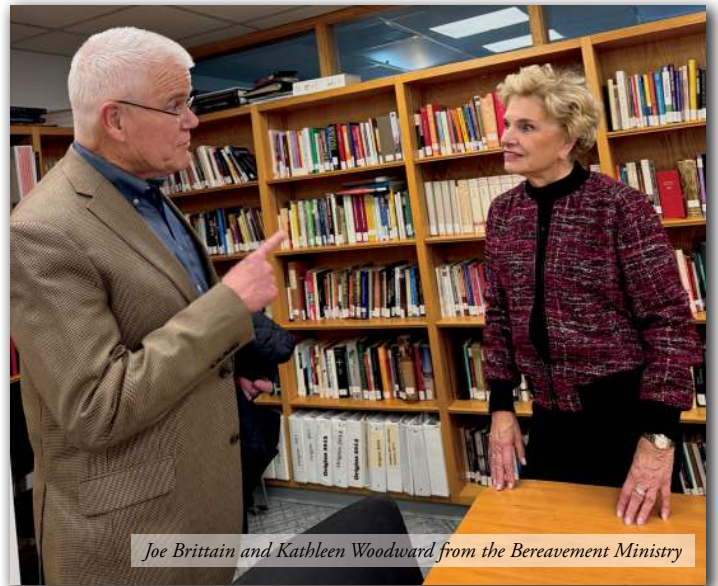

February is often called the month of love. Hearts, flowers, and kind words remind us of our desire to love and to be loved. The world celebrates the joys of human love. Yet in our busy and often anxious world, many of us are searching for something just as important as love: peace.

Peace is a gift from God. Jesus tells us, *"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."* (John 14:27). This peace is found when we place our trust in Christ and allow his love to shape our hearts.

For those whose loved ones are deceased whether the death was recent or occurred years ago, February can be an especially tough month. The weather is cold. You may find yourself isolating, feeling depressed, and lonely. We may find peace when we take time for prayer and or the Eucharist, where God heals, restores, and strengthens us.

This month of love invites us to reflect not only on romantic love, but on the self-giving love Christ models for us. When we love as He loves, freely, faithfully, and sacrificially, we open our hearts to the peace that only God can provide.

Death, however, deals a heavy blow to our confidence in love's magic; we crave the tangible magic the love originally came with, and death ends that. As Christians, however, we operate on the belief that the intangibles of love are eternal, beyond the bounds of our earthly life, no matter what befalls us here and now.

We remember that love does not end with death. We hold in prayer all who are grieving the absence of someone dear, trusting that God is close to the brokenhearted and that love remains eternal. We get this larger scope from Jesus,

May you be surrounded by understanding, comfort, and reminders that you are deeply loved.

Reflect on renewing our trust in the Lord, to deepen our love for one another, and to discover lasting peace by resting in His unfailing love.

We remember you, we honor your love, and we hold you in our hearts.
