First Sunday of Lent

Journeying With The Elect As They Prepare For The Easter Sacraments

Who are we on the day of election, when the bishop calls the catechumens to the Easter sacraments? We are an assembly who affirms our catechumens' readiness to be initiated through baptism, anointing, and Eucharist. (OCIA 9(3)) We are an assembly who says to the bishop that we "support them in faith, prayer and example." (OCIA 131)

From the day of election to the 40-day period of purification and enlightenment, when our catechumens – now the elect – are invited into a more intense time of spiritual preparation as they anticipate the Easter sacraments... who are we? We are Lenten people, who are called to "give the elect the example of [our] own renewal in the spirit of penance, faith, and charity." (OCIA 9(4))

The elect look to us to give authentic witness to living these spiritual disciplines – and not only during Lent. We are Lenten people who are present for the scrutiny rites celebrated with the elect, those rituals of self-searching and repentance. Why are we there? To pray with the elect that all that is "weak, sick, or sinful" in their hearts be healed and all that is "honorable, strong, and holy" within them be strengthened. (OCIA 141) This is our responsibility – as the baptized, as people who also know, at times,



weakness and sinfulness, and the need to be strengthened.

Who are we at the Easter Vigil, when our elect are plunged into the waters of baptism, incorporated into the Body of Christ, the Church? We are the baptized who find meaning in renewing our own baptismal promises (OCIA 9(4)), recommitting ourselves to the faith we profess and embody.

And after the Easter Vigil, our work is not yet done, for we are to "embrace the neophytes with charity, and help them to feel more at home in the community of the baptized."

(OCIA 9(5)) The neophytes are to “receive a full and joyful inclusion into the community,” which, in turn, renews the community. (OCIA 246)

We walk with our neophytes throughout the Easter season – and beyond – when we are called to grow together in deepening our understanding of the paschal mystery, making it part of our lives through reflection on the Gospel, sharing the eucharist, and doing the works of charity. (OCIA 244)

IGNATIAN CORNER

Reflection on Ignatian Contemplation

“Picture it. Sicily,” was how Sophia Petrillo began an imaginative story on The Golden Girls. Saint Ignatius of Loyola gives us a similar tool - praying with our imaginations (formally called Ignatian Contemplation).

When I first began praying in an Ignatian way, using my imagination seemed strange. My analytical brain and a lifelong interest in theology meant that I approached prayer as an intellectual exercise, asking the “why” questions about what scripture revealed about God. I gradually realized that in taking only the intellectual approach, I was missing what it was about a passage that spoke to my heart, what feelings

it evoked in me, and what those meant for my relationship with God.

Praying with my imagination helped me tap into those emotions. During Ignatian contemplation, prayer “puts you in the scene” of a Gospel story and asks you to experience it with your five senses. Picturing Jesus - seeing Him, hearing His voice - engages both my thoughts and my emotions. I can have a conversation with Him, freely share my feelings, ask Him what they mean, and discern where God is leading me.

Some practical tips from my experience -

- Pick a time and place where you’ll be alert. I have occasionally fallen asleep!
- While Holy Trinity-sponsored retreats have taught me how to pray (and I enthusiastically recommend them!!), when I am not on retreat, I like using Pray as You Go. Another wonderful resource are the reflections offered by several Holy Trinity parishioners on Youtube.
- Prayer can last however long you have or need - most Pray as You Go reflections are under 15 minutes. I hit the pause button when I need more time. Parishioner reflections are 5-10 minutes.
- You can pray anywhere - your home, your car, on the Metro, a walking path, in a faithsharing group, etc. I like to write my prayer so I need to sit somewhere with my notebook and pen.

One of my favorite things about Ignatian Spirituality is that God meets us where we are. Try a few things and find what helps tap into your relationship with God.
