## Jesus Met His Followers Where They Were

About a dozen years ago – a few years after my family joined Holy Trinity – my faith journey brought me to be a catechist in Shepherd's Flock, our religious education program for children and teens with developmental disabilities and autism. My professional experience was a good fit for the needs of the children in this class, but I also felt a deep calling to be a part of the vibrant community these families created within the parish. At that point, my son had not yet received an autism diagnosis nor had my daughter begun to experience the symptoms of dyslexia or an autonomic condition that causes chronic pain and fatigue. Still, the Shepherd's Flock families welcomed us with open arms and without judgment.

Shepherd's Flock draws in families from across the DMV. Many families come to us with painful stories of unwelcome – from facing angry stares or being asked to leave Mass because a child is too much of a distraction, to being told that their child cannot receive First Communion because it seems that they cannot understand. Recalling Jesus' ministry, I wonder – how many of us truly understand the sacrifice and gift of the Eucharist? The Gospels reveal a radically welcoming Christ, who sought out laborers, outcasts and children rather than the wealthy or the powerful.

Jesus met his followers where they were and taught them with stories that reflected the reality of their everyday lives,



while still challenging them to live with greater love for God and neighbor. Shouldn't we do the same?

Disability comes in many forms and at any stage of life. When a child lives with disability, whether visible or invisible, the whole family system is affected. In a culture that values people by their ability to be productive, parents and children may feel pressured to justify the need for rest, self-advocate for accommodations, apologize for the inconvenience perceived by others, and prove that their child and their family is worthy of extra help. Children with disabilities spend years learning to adapt to a world not

designed for them, and society is slow to adopt even simple changes that reduce barriers to participation.

If Holy Trinity Parish truly believes that God made each of us in His image, we have to embrace that every one of God’s children is whole, beautiful, and wonderfully made. Beyond that, we must ask ourselves how we are answering Pope Francis’ 2022 call for conversion of the Catholic community to move from inclusion as an aspiration or slogan to doing the necessary work to ensure that our community welcomes and supports the full participation of all people with disabilities as full members of the church. What in our habits, assumptions, and actions contributes to welcome or unwelcome?

While the needs of the families in the Shepherd's Flock community are diverse, there are some universal needs that everyone in our parish can address. First, belonging to a church community matters. Disability can be isolating for the whole family system, particularly at a liturgy filled with complicated language and unusual sensations. When a church community steps in — through shared prayer, flexibility, a smile or sitting nearby to say “we’re here,” by refraining from clapping or judgmental glances — it makes that experience less lonely and stressful. Community extends beyond the four walls of a building and creates church in our lives: a web of relationships that don’t require excuses or apologies and that don’t ignore or remove challenges, but make them bearable and give families strength to continue the journey.

Second, faith journeys may look different for these families. Past experiences of rejection make it difficult to trust that Mass will feel safe and welcoming. Children may not be able to communicate their faith, their questions, or their joys in ways that others easily understand. But a steadfast community that listens and loves with Christ’s patience can help these children and their families to walk humbly with God, embrace prayer, and rely on the living church. In the words of a dear friend, “My son might not say he walks with God, and yet I know that he does. I also know, though it took me some years to understand this, that my son’s faith journey is in God’s hands, not mine. And I have found the Church, through the care and support of that [community], to be my rock.”



Finally, families of children with disabilities need support and community, not pity. Disability brings additional challenges, but it’s important to allow joy and laughter to outweigh sorrow and loneliness. Our lives are different, not tragic. Pope Francis acknowledged that all Catholics have a combination of gifts and weaknesses and asked that the church meet the needs of those with disabilities for “belonging, relating to others and cultivating their spiritual lives so they experience the fullness and blessing of the Lord.”

Christ calls each of us to his table. Jesus has issued the welcome, and it comes with a charge to actively remove the barriers that prevent others from accessing the table, whether they be in the environment, in the greater society, or in our own hearts.
