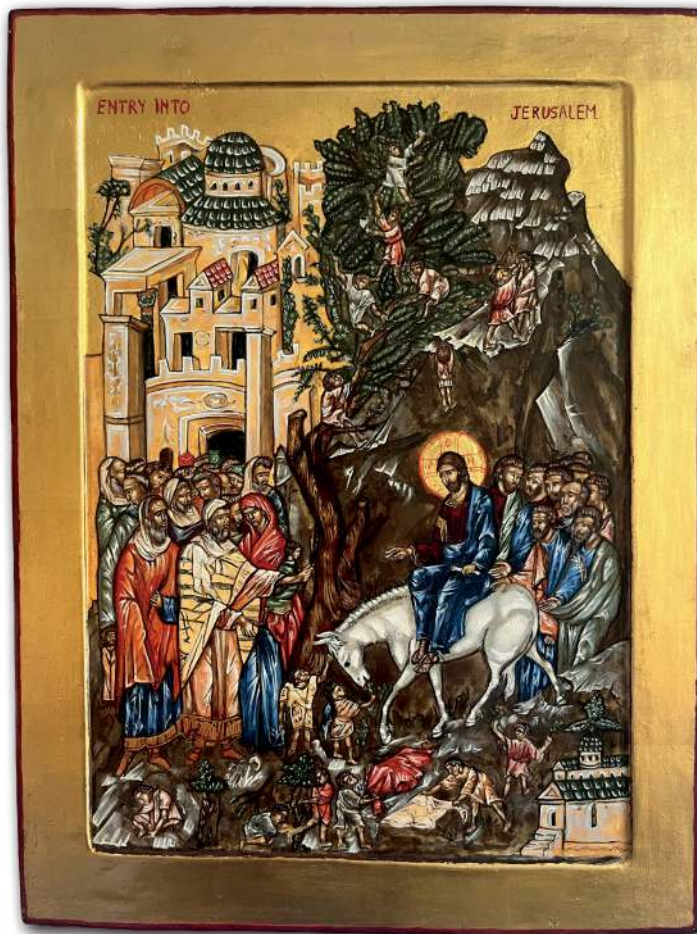

## Advancement and Stewardship Update

As we enter Holy Week, I want to share a brief update on our financial standing with three months remaining in our fiscal year (ending June 30). Your generosity sustains our mission, and for that we thank you!

**Collections Through February 2026.** Our parish operations are funded primarily by three sources that fall under the umbrella we call “Collections”: Weekly Offertory, Annual Pledge Campaign payments, and Holiday Appeals (Christmas, Easter, and Thanksgiving). At the end of February, we are 58% through the fiscal year. Here is how each category is performing against where we budgeted to be at this point:

Offertory and Pledge payments are both running ahead of budget. The shortfall in Holiday Collections reflects two things: an underperforming Christmas appeal and the timing of Easter, our largest remaining collection of the fiscal year. **Your Easter gift will make a real difference.**

**Where Your Gifts Go.** Your giving supports the full breadth of our parish, such as: support for weekly Masses attended by almost 2,000 people; 442 new parishioners welcomed; 149 Baptisms celebrated; 166 individuals received spiritual direction; 414 students receive religious education every Sunday; and over 10,000 meals served to those in need. Holy Trinity School has over 330 students and is a 2025 National Blue Ribbon School. We also tithe 10% of Annual Pledge Campaign revenue to fund our Social Justice programs and partners, which totaled \$550,000 last year and supported 32 organizations.

Every gift to Holy Trinity helps us worship, serve, teach, and welcome. Thank you for making this faith community a force for good.

**Lighting the Way Capital Campaign.** In addition to our annual operations, Holy Trinity is engaged in a capital campaign: *Lighting the Way*. This campaign addresses long-term facility and infrastructure needs across our campus—investments that will serve generations to come.

The campaign is currently in a leadership giving phase. During this stage, a group of parishioners is being invited to set the pace before the campaign opens more broadly. This is standard practice for campaigns of this scale and ensures a strong foundation of support before a wider invitation goes out.

Through February 2026, Lighting the Way has secured over \$3 million in pledges toward a \$14 million goal. This is over 20% of our target, and many of our pledges have begun to be fulfilled. We are grateful for the early commitment of those who have stepped forward, and we look forward to sharing more details with the full parish community in the months ahead.

**What's to Come?** We continue to build simpler tools for giving, registration, and communication — all in service of our shared mission. We wish you a blessed Holy Week and a joyful Easter, and look forward to communicating more this summer.

## MORNING PRAYER AND PREPARATION RITES WITH THE ELECT

**Holy Saturday, April 4** | 9:00 AM, Church

On Holy Saturday morning, we will celebrate the "preparation rites" with our Elect, who will be baptized that night at the Easter Vigil. There are two such preparation rites pulled forward from earlier centuries.

First, in the ancient Church, Christians shared the Creed with those seeking baptism shortly before their initiation into the Church. On Holy Saturday morning, those to be baptized recited the Creed, symbolically making it their own as they prepared to become members of the Body of Christ.

Second, by the 7th century, there is also evidence of a ritual called the *ephphetha*, an Aramaic word that means "be opened." (Aramaic was one of the Semitic languages at the time of Jesus; it was closely related to Hebrew.) Mark 7:31-37 provides the scriptural foundation for this rite. In this passage, people bring a deaf man with a speech impediment to Jesus. Jesus puts his fingers in the man's ears and touches his tongue, and says, "*ephphetha*." The man is able to hear and speak plainly.

Christians found this account compelling and incorporated it into prebaptismal rituals (which also included an anointing with the oil of exorcism - today called the oil of catechumens). The contemporary Church has preserved this *ephphetha* ritual. For the Elect, it is celebrated prior to baptism on Holy Saturday morning. The ears and lips of the Elect will be touched, as these words are prayed: "*Ephphetha*: that is, be opened, that you may profess the faith you hear, to the praise and glory of God."

## END-OF-LIFE CARE: ETHICAL CHALLENGES FOR THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Fr. Carlos Gómez-Vírseda, S.J., M.D., visiting scholar at the Pellegrino Center for Clinical Bioethics (Georgetown University), will present on the ethical challenges surrounding end-of-life care from a Catholic perspective, with particular attention to recent debates on euthanasia and assisted suicide. Drawing on real-life experience as both a physician and a priest, Fr. Gómez-Vírseda will reflect on how patients can be accompanied with compassion and dignity while navigating complex moral, clinical, and legal realities. 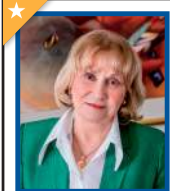
