Sixth Sunday of Easter

Mothers Nudge Us Toward Our Truest Selves

There are about 255 Catholic Dogma, which my high school Theology teacher told me was shorthand for the 'truths,' which are considered to comprise the beliefs of the Catholic Church. Four of them concern Mother Mary. Four. That's it. We believe in her conception, her virginity, her Assumption into heaven, and her role as Christ's Mother, *Theotokos*. Discovering this fact, this single digit devotion to the Blessed Mother in high school, was, at first, deflating. Revisiting it now, as an adult, a Catholic woman leader, and a mother, it feels rather more enlightening.

Leaving aside for the moment any of the Theology involved in understanding her sinlessness, her being, her assumption, I am struck by the fact of naming her as Jesus' mother. As a new-ish mom myself, I am bombarded with images of what motherhood means. My social media feeds are full of glorifying motherhood, or stressing about motherhood, or wellness-influencing motherhood, or commenting on the glory, the stress, and the lack of wellness.

As an educator in my 22nd year in schools, I have seen the immense power of mothers to shape and guide their children, to advocate for them, and to love them. Mary was that kind of mother, I think, because in addition to only four dogmas, we see her less frequently in the Bible than you might assume.



Referencing Mary in the Bible likely brings images to your mind of the Passion and Crucifixion, during which Mary typically appears as a lovely mother, a stalwart believer, and a grieving parent. Today I invite you to spend time with an earlier scriptural appearance. In the second chapter of the Gospel of John, we see the start of Jesus' public ministry with a story so familiar we likely rarely read it:

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.

Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding.

When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine."

[And] Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."

His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons.

Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim.

Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. (John 2: 1-8)

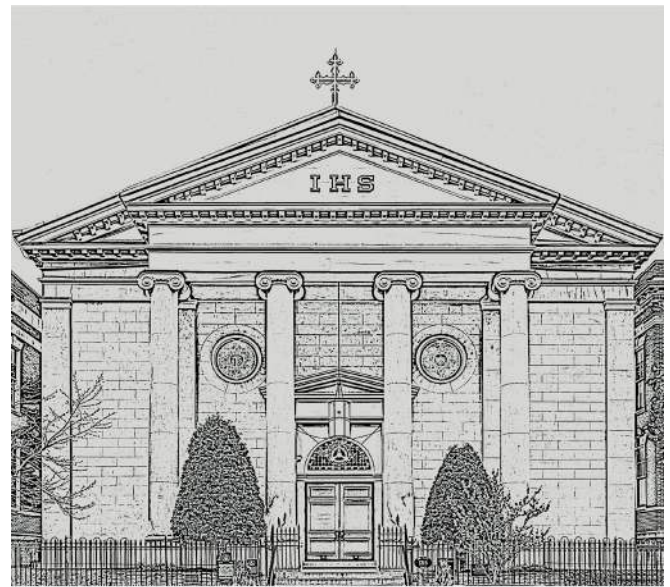
I think you know what happens next. The master of the house discovers that the water has become the finest wine and the wedding banquet is a joyous success. But basking in that success, we maybe miss the start.

Even Jesus needed his mother to give him a nudge, to remind him that he was ready. Because that's what mothers do. They see us, at our best and truest, and help the world to see us that way too. And it is this truth that I think the Church highlights in the dogma of *Theotokos*. To make the point that Mary is Jesus' mother also makes the point that it matters who was His mother, that mothers matter. This truth extends beyond even the biology of motherhood to all those women who see us with eyes that love and shine and encourage.

My devotion to Mary began with my own mother, before my own birth. My sisters and I were each named in some way to honor the Blessed Mother and taught to do so. I love to pray and teach the Rosary. For years I wore a miraculous medal that mom gave me on my first day of college at Georgetown. I can still remember the honor I felt the day I was asked to crown her in 2nd grade. My mom helped me twist and twine a beautiful crown from mini pink silk flowers.

As we grow, our relationships with mothers, aunts,

friends, and mother-figures likely also twist and twine. This May marks 17 years since I lost my mom, and yet I know her guidance is reflected in me every day, or at least every good day. I hope that this Mother's Day gives each of us a chance to celebrate the ways our mothers and mother-figures in our lives nudge us toward our truest selves, just like the maybe vaguely eye-rolling Blessed Mother did at the Wedding Feast where Christ first stepped forward on his journey to the Cross.


