Parishioners Attend the Second Indigenous Peacebuilding Summit

We started with a Haudenosaunee prayer to make our minds one. For each of the following, our leader gave thanks, and the packed room was asked to respond “toh” if we agreed.

- We give thanks to the Medicine. Toh.

- We give thanks to the Four Winds. Toh.
- We give thanks to the Thunders. Toh.
- We give thanks to the Sun. Toh.
- We give thanks to Grandmother Moon. Toh.
- We give thanks to the Stars. Toh.
- We give thanks to the enlightened Teachers. Toh.
- We give thanks to the Creator. Toh.

So began the Second Indigenous Peacebuilding Summit that took place April 25 – 26 in New York City. Six Holy Trinity parishioners helped at this event, which drew 300 Indigenous people from the Nuba Mountains of Sudan to Myanmar’s Kachin State, from the Crimea Tartar region

in Ukraine to New Zealand’s Maori confederation, from North Dakota to Canada to Guatemala and beyond.

They came from more than 80 countries, from native lands and refugee camps. Some came from our own backyard. **A collective mission.** Building on the 20-year-old UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples,

the summit sought to draft a resolution declaring 2027-2037 an International Decade on Indigenous Peacebuilding for presentation at the UN General Assembly in New York the following week.

Summit leader Binalakshmi Nepram, President of the Global Alliance of Indigenous Peoples, asserts 80 percent of the world’s conflict takes place on native lands. When war crosses a border, it first encounters Indigenous people, who’ve been pushed to the margins in every country. When mining companies arrive, Indigenous people are the land’s fiercest defenders.

“Proximity produces wisdom,” said Laura Gil, Assistant Secretary General of the Organization of American States.

Indigenous people are asking for a seat at the tables where peace is negotiated—with the aim to reduce global conflict by 50 percent. “At a time when we are witnessing a breakdown of international order, one of the most important things we can do is to listen to Indigenous peacebuilders,” said Aimee Breslaw, Affiliated Scholar with the Kroc Institute for Peace and Justice.

At the UN General Assembly, the Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues agreed to recommend the Indigenous Peacebuilding Decade to all member states.

A lesson in humility and courage. At this gathering of Indigenous legends, there were no professional photographers or flashing lights. Rather, the spirit in the basement gathering space was akin to a family reunion. Some of the leaders knew each other or knew of each other, but meeting in person isn’t easy. Their gratitude for their togetherness was palpable.

Over the two days, many spoke, and the room listened with stamina and respect. One woman summoned permission to speak on behalf of her ancestors with a shrill bird call. Many performed music, sang, or danced.

At times, the air hung heavy with grief. But more often, a spirit of hope prevailed. “The peace we carry is not a burden of the past,” said Tyler Running Wolf, member of the Blackfeet Nation and Montana House of Representatives. “It is the only fuel that will get us through the winter.”

For Holy Trinity, finding ways to support Indigenous communities is an extension of our burgeoning restorative justice work. This year, we’ll make our second title grant to an Indigenous project, this one supporting Indigenous college students studying in the DC area.

But since the summit, I find myself looking at the trees, water, sun, and moon with newfound gratitude. As the Church continues to pursue environmental stewardship, we’d be wise to look to, and support, the original stewards of our land—humbling role models for a more sustainable and peaceful future.
