The Holy Trinity School Class of 2026 Graduates *Students for Others Take Next Big Step*

As Holy Trinity School's Class of 2025 graduates, two members of the class reflect on their years of Catholic school education.

Sara Solomon: Nine years ago, I walked into Holy Trinity feeling nervous and out of place. I grabbed my mom's hand as we headed towards the playground. This was my first time meeting my new kindergarten classmates. My mom and I walked onto the playground, where we quickly spotted a group of girls from my grade, and because I was shy, my mom led me to them. Instead of some awkward glances, they smiled warmly and invited me to join their game. At that moment, all my nerves disappeared, and I knew this school was the best choice for me.

In a family with 5 kids, all of my siblings attended HTS. I don't know what it is about this school. Maybe it's the strong friendships, the amazing teachers, or the faith-filled community. But whatever it is, my parents never wanted us to go anywhere else. In this school, my experience was unforgettable.

Although I may not remember my whole time here at HTS, I remember many of the important memories. I remember the friendships I made with the funniest and sweetest classmates. I remember fun events we had, like the father-daughter dance and Field Days. Even some of our most recent events, such as our zoo field trip with our 1st and 2nd grade buddies, or confirmation with many of my classmates. All of these events created memories that I'll never forget.

One moment I'll never forget was my 8th grade Christmas show. Growing up, I would always watch the 8th graders getting ready backstage, performing in front of everyone, and having fun. This always excited me for when it was going to be my turn. Fast forward to 8th grade, the Christmas show quickly arrived. At first I was nervous, because even though I didn't have many lines, my role was being the voice of God, meaning that most eyes would be on me. As I looked throughout the Holy Trinity community gathered, I felt a special, bittersweet feeling while my classmates and I performed our lines.

The prospect of attending a new high school is exciting, but I realize that as I'm leaving HTS, I am saying goodbye to the one place where I made so many unforgettable memories. This school carries some of my most cherished

moments, and although it'll be hard to leave after 8th grade, it is comforting knowing that I have so many core memories that I can hold on to from HTS.

In HTS, I've learned many things. I've learned how to apply algebra in real life situations, read Shakespeare, talk about my daily life in Spanish, and write extensive lab reports. But I also learned important lessons through the challenges I've faced - such as a classmate leaving or a teacher passing away. All of these experiences taught me new things. They've taught me to be brave and responsible, but most importantly, they've taught me that I'm not alone. Being in the HTS community has shown me that there are always people willing to support you, even if you barely know them. That's what makes this school so special.

As my time at HTS comes to an end, I know leaving this school will not be easy. Even though I will be moving on to high school, I will always have a place here at HTS. The memories, friendships, and lessons I gained during my years here will stay with me forever. No matter where I go in the future, HTS will always feel like home to me.

Samuel Solomon: As I made my way to the Smithsonian Zoo with my first grade buddy, I found myself reflecting on seven years earlier, when I was the first grader excited for the very same trip. The bus was filled with excited conversations about seeing the animals and spending time with friends, but what we were most excited about was meeting our eighth grade buddies, the students we all looked up to. Throughout my years at Holy Trinity, I admired my buddies and hoped to one day be like them. Now, I had become the older student guiding and supporting a younger buddy of my own. Feeling both nostalgic and bittersweet, I spent the day trying to be the same kind, caring role model that I had once looked up to so much.

My experience at Holy Trinity was central to helping me become the person that I am today. From academics, to my personality, and faith, HTS has always helped me develop these personalities and traits, shaping me into the young man I am. While my family played a vital role in fostering my relationship with God, HTS helped to steadily build the foundation of my faith. Whether it was through reading interesting parables or discussing different ideas about our faith, I was always learning more about Catholicism and deepening my faith.

Through different service projects and opportunities to help others, I learned what it truly means to be a "person for others". Over the years, I began to understand that even small acts of service can make a meaningful difference in someone's life. These experiences helped shape my character and taught me lessons that I will continue to carry with me long after I leave Holy Trinity.

Looking back on my years at Holy Trinity, I realize how much this school has shaped me into the person I am today. Through the friendships I formed, the lessons I learned, and the experiences I shared with others, I have grown academically, spiritually, and personally. HTS taught me the importance of faith, kindness, leadership, and service, and these are traits that I will continue to carry with me throughout high school and beyond. Although I may be leaving Holy Trinity School, the memories, values, and life lessons it gave me will always remain a part of who I am.

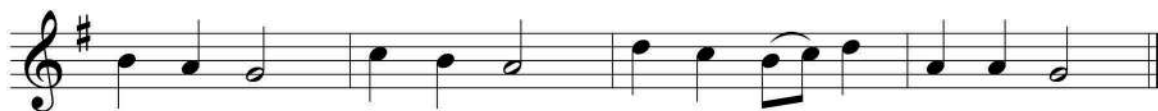
