We are in the final days of our fiscal year, which ends on June 30. This final update shows how your gifts to Holy Trinity sustain our mission: A Jesuit parish that Welcomes All to Accompany One Another in Christ, Celebrates God's Love, and Transforms Lives.

### Thank You

Thank you for your continued commitment, generosity, and prayers. Holy Trinity is blessed by the kindness of thousands of parishioners, and we understand that your philanthropy and support extend to other organizations as well. We remain grateful to be included in your charitable priorities.

### Where We Stand: Collections Through May 2026

Our parish operations are funded primarily by three sources we group under "Collections": Weekly Offertory, Annual Pledge Campaign payments, and Holiday Collections (Christmas, Easter, and Thanksgiving). At the end of May, we are 92% through our fiscal year. Here is the picture:

### A Quiet, Powerful Gift: Bequests and Beyond

Beyond our regular Collections, one category has shaped this year in a remarkable way: Bequests.

Through May, Bequests total \$342,212 against a \$200,000 annual budget — 171% goal attainment. A single \$293,000 bequest received in April reflects this kind of

long-term love for this parish, and the story will be shared in August. We are fortunate to have received an additional bequest earlier this month – a \$295,000 donation. These legacy gifts ensure Holy Trinity’s bottom line is met in the event of any shortfall in Collections, which will be the case this year. We are blessed with parishioners who continue to support us in this manner.

A bequest is simply a gift made to Holy Trinity through your will, trust, or other estate plan vehicles. It costs nothing during your lifetime and yet can become one of the most enduring forms of support a parishioner can leave. ### **Lighting the Way Capital Campaign**

Our capital campaign, Lighting the Way, continues to make significant progress. The campaign remains in its leadership-giving phase, during which a group of parishioners has been invited to set the pace before the campaign opens more broadly to the entire parish. This sequence is standard practice for campaigns of this scale and ensures a strong foundation before the wider invitation goes out.

Through May 2026, Lighting the Way received over \$5.3 million in capital campaign gifts and total commitments, so we are well on our way toward our \$14 million goal. We are deeply grateful to those who have already stepped forward.

The broader parish invitation is approaching. In the year ahead, every household will hear directly about how Lighting the Way will shape the future of our campus, our worship, and our faith community. ## IGNATIAN CORNER

### SPIRITUAL CONSOLATION AND DESOLATION

I have been in faith sharing groups for many years. Since I became a faith sharing group facilitator at Holy Trinity, however, my faith has been enriched by recognizing spiritual consolations and desolations in my life, following the principles of Ignatian spirituality.

St Ignatius of Loyola defines spiritual consolation as “when some interior motion is caused in the soul through which it comes to be inflamed with love for its Creator and Lord.” In other words, an experience that brings us closer to God resulting in an increase of faith, hope, and love or any quality we know are fruits of the Spirit.

Spiritual desolation is “the opposite of the above, a darkness of the soul, a disturbance in it, which leads to a separation from its Creator.” In other words, an experience that may lead us to question or not trust in God, and may cause a decrease in faith, hope, and/or love.

Spiritual consolation and desolation are more than a feeling, they are a state of being, a lens through which we look at the world.

For example, a spiritual consolation might be an increased awareness of God because of a beautiful sunset, or a walk in the woods, or observing an amazing wildflower. We might feel an increase in our faith, hope, and love for others because of the kind gesture of a stranger. These are moments of grace we receive every day.

Spiritual desolation might cause us to feel a darkness and a disturbance that fills our soul. Do our experiences leave us doubting that the Lord is active in our lives? Spiritual desolation might make us feel that God has abandoned us.

You may be wondering — what can you do to develop a practice of recognizing the spiritual consolations and desolations in daily life? Some things that have helped me are the use of the examen, keeping a daily journal documenting the moments that God was active in my life; keeping up my prayer life, and acknowledging that, although we have free will, we are not in control. God has a plan for each one of us.

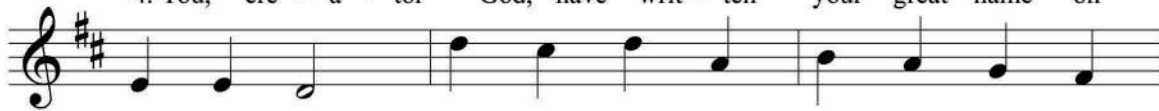
