Holy Trinity Awards Record

\$631,000 to Community Organizations

Perhaps you have heard about “the tithe” at Holy Trinity but how much do you know about what it is, when it began, and how it works in practice at our parish? Let’s start with a quiz:

What percent of Holy Trinity’s funds are set aside for the tithe each year?

- a. 1
- b. 5
- c. 10

What is the approximate amount Holy Trinity has donated through the tithe fund since 2006?

- a. \$1.8 Million
- b. \$5.5 Million
- c. \$8.3 Million

What is the amount that Holy Trinity distributed through the tithe this year?

- a. \$231,000
- b. \$431,000
- c. \$631,000

If you guessed “c” for all of the above, you are correct! The tithe at Holy Trinity began in 1984 with the parish making an enduring commitment to dedicate 10 percent of parishioners’ regular offerings to address root causes of issues affecting the most vulnerable in our society.

So, how are organizations selected? Each year, the Tithe Committee, a subgroup of the Social Justice Committee, led by Social Justice Pastoral Associate, Ashley Klick, meets to arrive at a slate of organizations that they



recommend receive grants from Holy Trinity. Tithe recipient categories include Large Grants, Small Grants, Sister Parishes, and Jesuit educational institutions.

Large Grants: Every Fall, the Social Justice Committee identifies an annual topic for the Large Grant, a grant of \$50,000-\$100,000, intended to make a particular impact in an area of pressing need. The committee considers the priorities of Jesuit apostolic preferences and those of our parish to arrive at a consensus on the Large Grant focus for the year. In the Fall and early Winter, the tithe committee identifies and reaches out to organizations working in the selected focus area and places the request for grant proposals on relevant sites. By March, the tithe committee has read and evaluated all the grant applications and decided on the finalists, who then submit a more detailed application and answer targeted questions. Next, the tithe committee interviews all finalists and makes their recommendations for grant recipients and the amounts to be allocated.

This year, the topic selected was health care, including medical, dental, and prescription drugs for low-income

individuals. The committee allocated \$95,000 to The National Center for Children and Families to fund a mobile dental van providing dental care to low-income primarily African-American residents. Thanks to this grant, over 160 people will receive dental care, impacting their health and overall well-being. Arlington Free Clinic received \$75,000 to provide health care for low-income, Medicaid ineligible adult residents of Arlington County, with Holy Trinity's grant funding medical care for 270 individuals.

Small Grants: the largest portion of the tithe goes to Small Grants, which range from \$5000 to \$20,000. This year, 93 organizations applied for a Small Grant and 30 received an award, with \$366,00 total awarded. In March and April, the tithe committee reads, evaluates, and discerns which organizations to recommend for funding. The committee considers community need, the potential impact of Holy Trinity's funds, the strength of the organization, and Holy Trinity's ties to the organization. Recipient organizations work in areas including Returning Citizens, Housing, Immigration, Youth, Sexual Violence and Human Trafficking, Food Insecurity, and the Environment.

The tithe also supports our Sister Parishes in El Salvador, Haiti, and Bethlehem and several Jesuit schools who educate low-income students in the DC area.

In May, the tithe committee's recommendations are presented to the Social Justice Committee and to Father Gillespie for his review and approval. The funds are distributed in June.

It is through the generosity of parishioners and the support of our pastor that this year Holy Trinity was able to support transitional housing for pregnant and parenting teens, a literacy program aimed at low-income elementary school students, a day center for homeless women, services for immigrant survivors of violence including human trafficking, reentry programming for the formerly incarcerated so they can pursue their educational and career goals, and a mentoring program for foster and at-risk youth, among many other worthy programs. So, thank you for supporting Holy Trinity. Hopefully, you can see what an impact your contributions are having in our community to help those most in need.

A snapshot of some of our 2026 recipients:

National Center for Children & Families/Smiles Go (\$95,000) *New!* The National Center for Children & Families operates the Black Physicians and Healthcare Network that expands healthcare equity for the Black community through increased access to affordable,

quality healthcare. The funds will be used to implement the Smiles2Go Program to reduce oral health inequities for Black residents in Montgomery County.

Arlington Free Clinic (\$75,000) *New!* Arlington Free Clinic (AFC) is the only provider of high-quality, comprehensive, culturally competent, compassionate, no-cost physical and mental healthcare and low-cost oral healthcare services for low-income, uninsured, adult Arlington County residents. The grant will support approximately 271 patient visits at an average cost of \$276 per visit.

Healthy Babies Project (\$20,000) *New!* Healthy Babies Project is a community-based nonprofit that empowers low-income District of Columbia youth to build healthy, stable lives. The funds will support their Teen Parent Empowerment Program.

Free Minds (\$20,000) *New!* The mission of Free Minds is to build community and to foster personal development and systems change for incarcerated and formerly incarcerated youth and adults through the literary arts, workforce development, trauma healing, peace-building, and member-led advocacy. Funds will be used to support their innovative reentry programming for DC youth and adults.

Mary House (\$20,000) Mary House is a community-based organization that provides transitional housing and support services to low-income immigrant and refugee families. The grant will help bridge the difference between what immigrant and refugee families can afford to pay and what it actually costs to provide stable housing and the programs that make independence possible.

Wanda Alstun Foundation (\$5,000) *New!* The Wanda Alstun Foundation provides housing, support services and pathways to economic mobility to DC's homeless LGBTQ+ youth. The grant will support the launch of the Workforce Navigation Center to equip at-risk youth with critical skills to achieve independence.

Washington Jesuit Academy (\$10,000) A tuition-free Catholic school, the Washington Jesuit Academy provides a nurturing, individualized, and comprehensive education to 4th-8th grade boys from underserved communities in the DC metro area. Funding will support the Office of Student and Alumni Success program which provides graduates with comprehensive programming, equitable resources, and meaningful mentoring through high school and college.

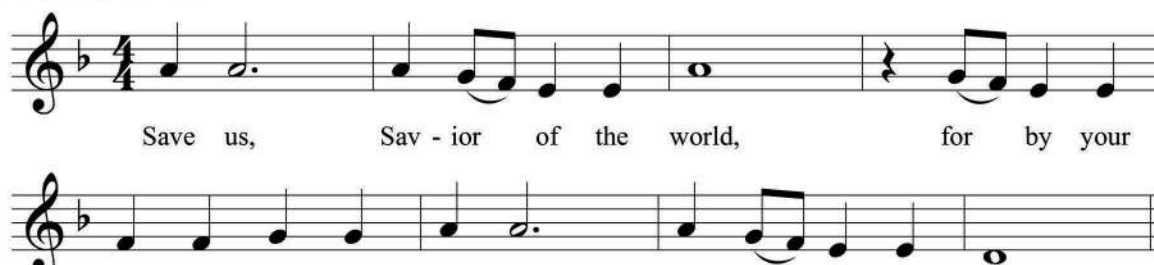

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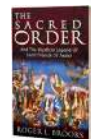
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
