Holy Trinity School Girl Scouts Help Immigrants And Refugees While Pursuing Bronze Award

We are Troop 42239, and we are rising 6th graders at Holy Trinity School. We are working on obtaining our Bronze Award, which is a service project that Girl Scouts do as Junior level scouts.

When working on our Bronze Award, we look for problems in our community and how we can help solve them. We spend 20+ hours working toward this goal. We develop problem-solving skills while showing dedication through research and planning. Working on our Bronze Award teaches us how we can make a difference.

While planning our Bronze Award, we asked ourselves three questions, and answered them:

- First, how can we make a difference? We want to create a more welcoming community for immigrants and refugees, while also raising awareness of how hard it is to leave your home country.
- Second, who do we want our project to benefit? We want our project to benefit immigrants and refugees.



- Third, how will we know that we have made a difference? Our Troop will know that we have made a difference when our community is more educated and more welcoming towards immigrants and refugees.

Our Troop wanted to help neighbors in need. After doing research we decided on helping the immigrants and refugees at the Refugee Social Services (RSS). RSS is a branch of Catholic Charities (a nonprofit organization in DC) which helps people in need.

When we visited RSS as a troop we were especially drawn to their boutique and food pantry where anyone can go to get clothes, toiletries, toys, and basic necessities that they may not otherwise have access to. They also have booklets in many languages that describe simple things like how to obey traffic signs or how to take medication. These booklets are a great resource to help immigrants navigate life in the US.

RSS focuses on education, employment, and helping clients get access to social service benefits. It provides case workers, referrals to lawyers, language classes, and housing, and strives to be a stable source of support and trust for immigrants, refugees, and also victims of human trafficking.

This experience has taught us the importance of giving back to our community and especially its newest members. After speaking with the amazing staff at RSS and meeting some of their clients, we understood we were helping a community of hard workers and brave, kind people. We heard their powerful stories about challenges they faced to come to the US and really wanted to help!

Our project focuses on creating a welcoming environment for immigrants and refugees while building trust with them. In addition to a supply drive, we'll make welcome cards in many languages and host a bagel breakfast at RSS to meet the people we are helping and get to know them better.

For this project to succeed we need help from our community at Holy Trinity! Immigrants need simple things we use in everyday life without even noticing it. Most of us do not think about the price of the toothpaste we use, the cost of shampoo, or providing for other basic needs of our families. These are things that RSS clients think about everyday.

We want to help them by donating pantry staples, toiletries, and diapers—and you can help us provide these essentials! Scan the QR code at right to visit our Amazon wishlist for the items RSS need the most.
