Legacy Sunday A Gift That Endures

When Anthony and Julia Albrecht found their parish home at Holy Trinity in their later years, they brought with them a lifetime of dedicated and devoted service both in their faith and for their country that spanned the world.

Julia, a former State Department officer, spent more than two decades with the Ignatian Volunteer Corps — helping the unemployed and formerly incarcerated find work and rebuild dignity through Jubilee Jobs and Montgomery County's Pre-Release and Reentry Services.

Anthony, a retired U.S. diplomat who rose to the rank of Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs, served alongside her for those same two decades at IVC. A poet, a painter, and a faithful Catholic, he matched her generosity with his own.

Their lives together saw them work and pray in Belgium, Spain, and Nicaragua. Over 68 years of marriage, they were blessed with four sons and four grandchildren.



Julia passed in February 2023, and Anthony followed in March 2025. Both are interred at Calvary Cemetery, near Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where Anthony was born. This spring, their family ensured that the parish they loved would continue to be a place that welcomes everyone, accompanies one another in Christ, and transforms lives.

A gift of nearly \$294,000 from the Albrechts' estate came to Holy Trinity — funds that will help us assist the next

generation of Holy Trinity families seeking the same Ignatian formation that drew the Albrechts here.

Legacy gifts like this are not a substitute for what we give in the annual pledge campaign or the offertory basket each Sunday. They are something special and equally vital: they ensure the Holy Trinity can meet its financial obligations for everyday parish life, including salaries, capital repairs, ministry expansion, faith formation, and accompaniment.

The 1792 Society — named for the year our parish was founded — honors more than 100 parishioners who, like the Albrechts, have chosen to remember Holy Trinity in their wills, trusts, retirement accounts, or other planned gifts. There is no minimum gift. Joining can be as simple as adding a single line to your will, naming Holy Trinity as a beneficiary of an IRA or life insurance policy.

August is Make-A-Will Month. We highlight Julia and Anthony to encourage you to think about your legacies. Because intentions left unrecorded too often go unfulfilled. HTS GIRL SCOUTS COLLECT FOR REFUGEE SOCIAL SERVICES

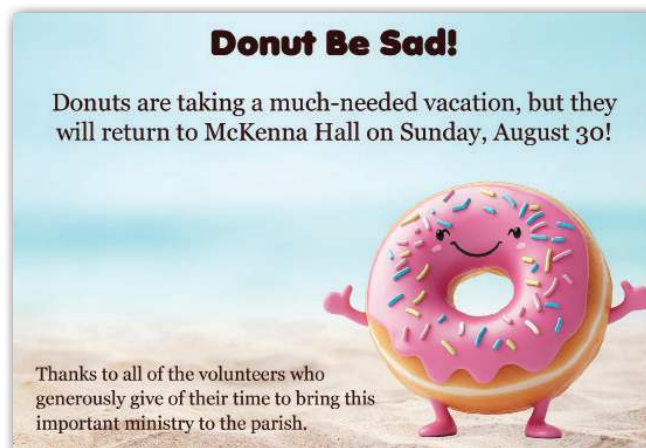
