One Body, One Mission In Christ

The word that usually rings in my ears as the summer sun starts to give way to some fall breezes is wonder. There is something sacred about the beginning of a school year. The scratch of a new pencil, the bright welcome of fresh classrooms, the joyful greetings as students reunite. Whatever the school, we are always grateful for the children entrusted to our care. They bring joy, energy, curiosity, and faith that can remind all of us to see the world with fresh eyes. Our students fill our halls with just such wonder.

All of the cliched things you hear teachers say about schools are true—I know this year will bring incredible moments of humility, compassion, perseverance, courage, justice, and gratitude, along with some healthy doses of faith and learning. Our children really will teach us as much as we teach them. They will remind us that growth takes time, that grace is a gift of God's love and life, freely given, often in unexpected ways, and that God is found in all things.

As I reflect on the start of this school year, though, my mind is drawn beyond the students to think and pray



about the adult communities that surround them. None of us grows in faith alone. We need people who encourage, challenge, listen, forgive, pray, and walk alongside us. Our children need us not only to teach them, but to model what it means to live as people of faith, and as a community of faith.

When St. Ignatius of Loyola and his first companions gathered together, they did not know exactly what their future would hold. They were united by a desire to seek God, discern God's will, and serve wherever they were most needed. They prayed together, learned together,

supported and challenged one another, and placed themselves at the service of the Church and the world. Through prayer and discernment, they sought to recognize where God was calling them and responded with generosity. Their faith became a way of life—a commitment to serve God and one another, to lead others toward Christ, and to seek justice.

This year, when I welcomed back the faculty and staff at Holy Trinity School, I asked them to think about St. Ignatius and these first Jesuits, whose letters show an immense amount of genuine concern for one another, even in the midst of the responsibility in their mission to spread the Gospel. We want our children to see adults who live their faith with joy, humility, courage, and compassion—to understand that faith is something we live through prayer, relationship, service, and love.

As I watch our classrooms come together and see our bulletin boards gain a little more color after their summer refresh, I find myself looking forward with excitement and gratitude. I hope to carry with me not only the wonder of a child at the beginning of something new, but also the faith and courage of those first companions of St. Ignatius who stepped forward without knowing exactly where the path would lead, trusting that God would reveal the way.

May we begin this school year with that same trust, wonder, and hope, finding God in one another and trusting that, together, we can help our children discover who God is calling them to become.

SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY LAUNCHES “ONE PARISH ONE PRISONER” (OPOP)

The Holy Trinity Social Justice Ministry has assembled a team of nine Parish members to build an accompanying relationship with an individual who is one year away from being released after nearly twenty years of incarceration. Initial letters of introduction have been sent by each team member to the returning citizen, who has been confined in several distant U.S. corrections facilities. Guided by the experience and expertise of “Underground Ministries” near Seattle, WA, the OPOP team will develop a relationship of trust and support with the individual who will soon return to the Washington, DC community. More than one-hundred church parishes from multiple denominations in the Western U.S. have built similar supportive relationships with returning citizens, and the Holy Trinity effort will be the first OPOP initiative on the East Coast.

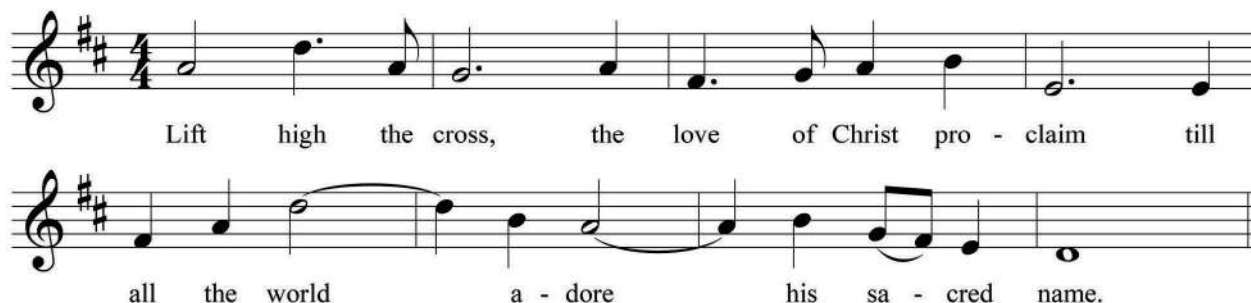

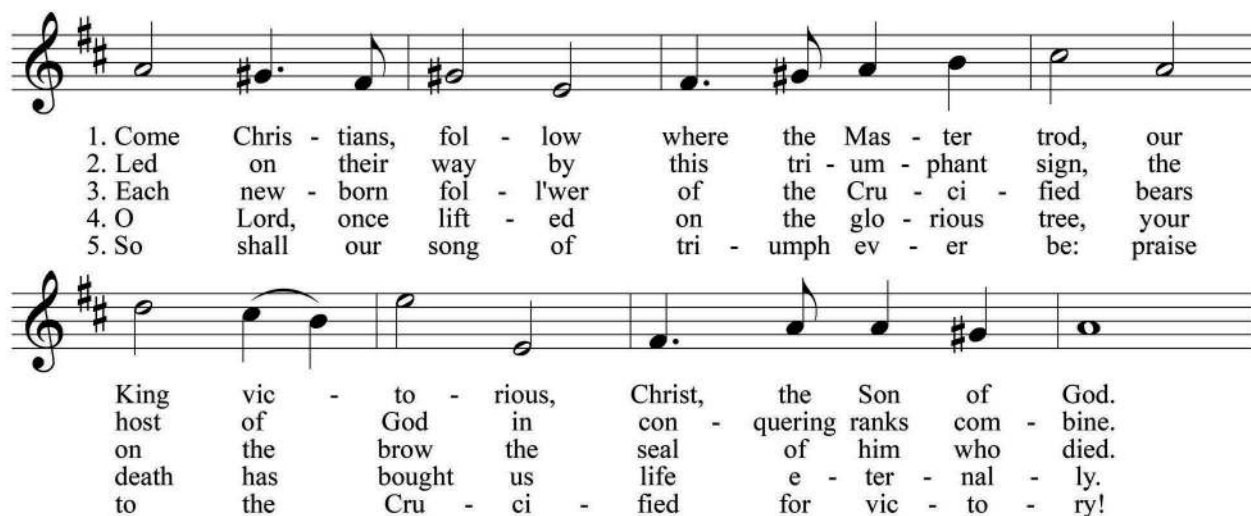

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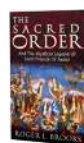
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
