Prayer, Simplicity, Service and Community at Bethlehem Farm

Prayer, Simplicity, Service and Community form the foundation of Bethlehem Farm, a Catholic faith-based community in Appalachia. This summer I accompanied five high school students from Holy Trinity Parish on a week-long service retreat at Bethlehem Farm in Alderson, West Virginia. Set on 90 acres in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains, this former Catholic Worker farm has transformed into a self-sustaining community dedicated to care for God's creation and the principles of Catholic Social Teaching.

Our group was not quite sure what to expect from this trip. It has been quite some time since I have had to live in a community with strangers, or done manual labor. The students were all good natured but also a little anxious about what farm life might be like. The one thing we did know was that once we arrived there would be no technology. No phones, no watches, no TV or radio. One whole week disconnected from our devices and the world.

"Welcome Home", these are the first words you hear when you arrive at the farm. The caretakers and summer servants come out of the house to greet you with a



warm hug welcoming you home. Audrey was particularly touched by this demonstration of community. "The minute we arrived at Bethlehem Farm we were greeted with the saying "Welcome Home" and a hug, creating a positive community that worked alongside each other. I had never experienced something like this before from people I didn't know." The community at Bethlehem Farm opens your eyes to a different way of life. You pray together, work together and learn how to live in service to one another and God's creation.

Care for God's creation manifests itself in many different ways on the farm, some familiar and some not, limiting

water and electricity (bucket showers, sawdust toilets and an electricity fast), eating sustainably (farm grown, organic and local), and a general reduction in consumption. Audrey said, "I have always been interested in the environment and sustainability and many of the practices on the farm inspired me to reflect on how I live and where my food comes from." This pillar of simplicity stood out to many in our group, "The simplicity of being surrounded by nature without distractions inspired me to think about the simple beauty of our world." - Sophie

During our week we had many opportunities to pray for and with one another. We started each day with morning prayer, prayed before meals, prayed with the work crews before they left the farm and prayed on the job site before returning home. We finished each day with evening prayer. Prayer at the farm takes many different forms. We made collages, wrote poems and walked through the pasture to the pond. Mary said, "Prayer at Bethlehem Farm really stood out to me. My experience showed me the many different ways of prayer that I have never seen or heard about and I really want to start praying like that."

"Grab an impactor and meet me over there." Bethlehem Farm operates a home repair service for the local community. Home owners only pay what they can for materials and all the labor is free. They rely on groups like ours to help with the repairs but the construction manager and caretakers work year round on home repair projects. The demand is high and the list of needs is endless. Many of the projects help to make homes more energy efficient reducing the homeowners heating and cooling costs and positively impacting the environment. Our group replaced windows, installed the underpinning of a mobile home, and built a sturdy set of stairs for a disabled veteran. Grace said, "I loved learning how to use power tools, especially the miter saw. Cutting at an angle, measuring twice, cutting once. Marcus and Ryan were so patient and taught me so much. The best part was the pride in the homeowner's eyes when he saw the beautiful and secure steps we had built."

We left the farm on Saturday with our lives significantly richer than when we arrived. We made new friends, learned how to take a bucket shower, and grew closer to God and one another. Our task is to figure out how

to bring the prayer, simplicity, service and community of Bethlehem Farm home with us. Use less water, be sure to turn the lights out when you leave the room, talk to your neighbors, cook a meal and invite a friend to dinner, spend time outside. Jimmy, the photographer in our group, took this beautiful photo with a message that blesses you as you leave the farm. "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord." And we intend to do just that.

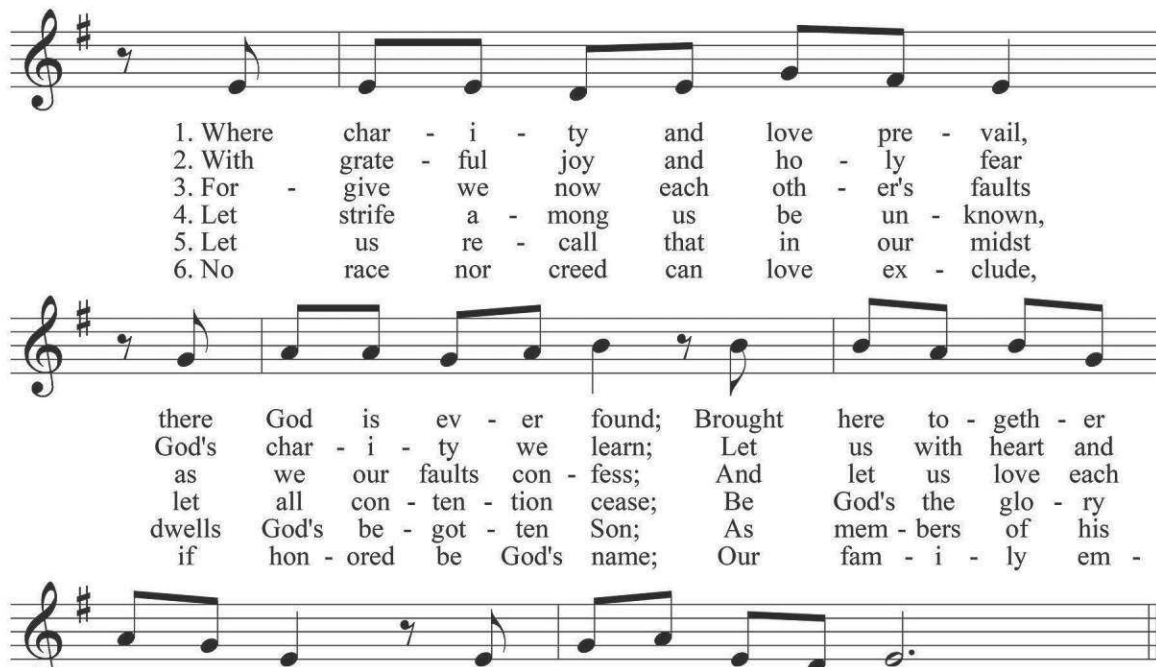

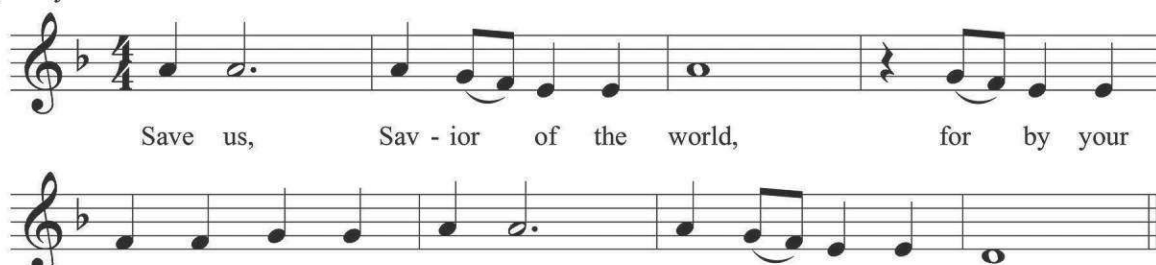

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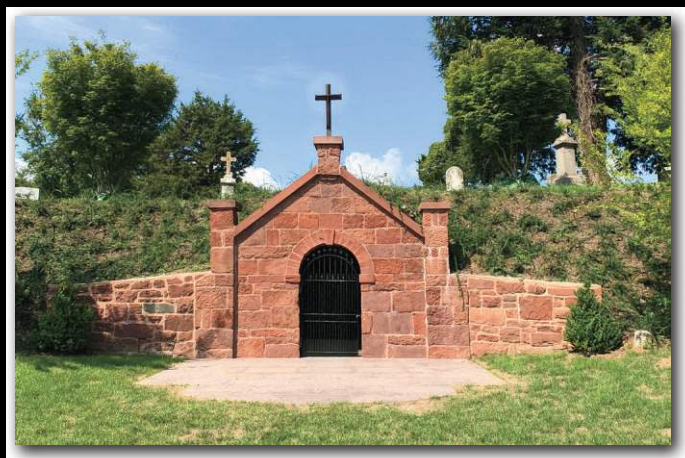
COFFEE & DONUTS HOSPITALITY MINISTRY SEEKING VOLUNTEERS

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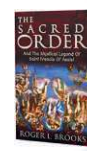
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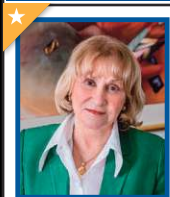
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
