What Makes Holy Trinity a Unique Parish? Ignatian Spirituality

I attended a wine and cheese event for new parishioners and each person I met spoke about what attracted them to Holy Trinity. They felt there was something unique about our parish. Yes, the parish is welcoming, and the liturgies and preaching are powerful, but they sensed there was something deeper going on they could not name. Let me suggest that the difference is that Holy Trinity is a Jesuit parish. What makes a Jesuit parish different is that we are inspired by the life and spirituality of St. Ignatius of Loyola (1451-1556) the founder of the Jesuits and by the Spirituality of the Jesuits. The power source behind Ignatian Spirituality is the Spiritual Exercises, which is the retreat created by Ignatius.

Ignatian Spirituality inspires our liturgies, the way we offer the sacraments, and our preaching. It guides and motivates our dedication to work for social justice, to promote peacemaking, and to work on behalf of the poor and marginalized. It informs our approach to religious education and faith formation, and it moves us to offer retreats in daily life, spiritual direction, and the Spiritual Exercises. So, how does Ignatian Spirituality make Holy Trinity so unique and appealing? Let us consider select features that make Trinity unique and then explore how Ignatian Spirituality is the source of this uniqueness.



A Welcoming Spirit. Many people experience Holy Trinity as a welcoming place where they feel accepted and at home. (At least I hope you have experienced this!) The parish recognizes and celebrates the dignity of each person and the diversity found within the human family. It also celebrates the beauty of God's creation, especially in our liturgies and on the grounds of the parish. We regularly offer community building events. Behind this welcoming spirit lies Ignatian Spirituality with its emphasis on the constant generosity of God the Creator; who welcomes

all creation and every person into existence at every moment and creates each person with an inherent dignity as an image of God. That welcoming spirit is also inspired by Jesus Christ who is at the center of Ignatian Spirituality. Jesus welcomed the leper, blind Bartimeus, the Samaritan woman, and even Peter after he denied him. Holy Trinity seeks to embody the welcome Jesus constantly offered the lost and lonely, the sick and suffering, the outcast and rejected.

A Compassionate and Merciful Spirit. When parishioners speak to our priests and engage with our spiritual directors, teachers, and staff, they often experience a spirit of compassion and mercy. This can happen during the Sacrament of Confession or when we serve a meal to the hungry on Sunday night, or when a stressed parent speaks to a teacher or spiritual director. What inspires this spirit of compassion is the mercy of Christ, which is a key feature of Ignatian Spirituality, and at the heart of the Spiritual Exercises. During the First Week of the Exercises as the retreatant considers the sin of the world and their participation in it, the retreatant discovers deep within that dark disorder the mercy of Christ. Jesus constantly offered people his forgiveness and freedom, whether it was the paralytic, the woman who cried at his feet, or the woman caught in adultery. He extended his compassion to the hungry and sick by feeding and healing them. After his resurrection Jesus offered his mercy to the very disciples who betrayed him by appearing to them in the upper room and offering them his peace. The risen Lord living in our midst constantly calls us to embody and make real his mercy and compassion in people's lives.

Our Faith Becomes Real and Alive. One of the most attractive features of a Jesuit parish is how it can make our faith real and alive as it feeds our deepest hungers. Holy Trinity seeks to feed the hungers of the heart with beautiful liturgies, preaching that speaks to our lives, adult faith formation, retreats, and the many opportunities to serve those in need. The parish gives us permission to take God, Jesus and our faith life seriously. It is the presence and power of the Holy Spirit at work in every facet of our parish life that connects us to the risen Jesus, making our faith alive and real. At the heart of Ignatian Spirituality is the person, life, death and resurrection of Jesus. What enables the passing on of our faith real is an encounter with priests and lay people who live from a dynamic

relationship with the risen Jesus. There is such a difference between getting secondhand information and meeting a person who knows God firsthand or experiencing it for yourself! This is the great gift of Ignatian Spirituality. Every facet of our parish life is dedicated to offering you this gift.

In a Jesuit parish, knowing Jesus is not the only goal. Jesus the King always calls us to participate in his mission. He asks us to share what he has given to us with others, especially the poor and vulnerable. This too makes our faith become real and alive

Reality is Taken Seriously. Sometimes people notice how in a parish like Holy Trinity, real life is taken seriously, and this is accompanied by an informed, intelligent, and critical look at reality. We offer a parish book club where we discuss fascinating theology books (they do exist). Our homilies and pastoral reports draw on well informed resources. We try to feed the hearts and minds of the people. Preaching is not just the promotion of piety but is the result of deep prayer with Scripture and study of the readings and a serious consideration of the issues of the day and how our faith speaks to them. What drives this commitment to take reality seriously and to engage ministry in a critical and intelligent way is the incarnation. A central contemplation of the Second Week of the Spiritual Exercises is the incarnation, where God takes creation and humanity so seriously that the Creator becomes one of us.

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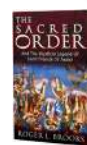
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
