"Even Just One of These Children"

Marie and Christina started strong—bowling spares on their very first frame. Five-year-old Johannys, a dynamo with an overhand approach, steered clear of the alleys somehow. And ninth grader Gladys, efficient and poised, bowled the day's earliest strike, then turned to her audience with a radiant smile.

At Pinstripes in Georgetown last Sunday, the children and teens of our migrant family formed a raucous, happy band, finding fun and support—with each other, and with their mentors.

The Holy Trinity migrant team is in its 9th year of accompanying immigrants in our community: families from 14 countries, newly arrived in the DMV. Our latest venture is a youth mentorship program, led by parishioner Lauren Woodard, a PhD student in clinical psychology, and an enterprising recruiter of young adult volunteers, who pair up to accompany a school-aged child or teen.

Following her graceful bowling move, Gladys and her mentor huddled over a smart phone, examining her school's extra-curricular schedule, searching for field hockey try-outs and Homecoming news, planning the week ahead.

Mentors befriend their mentees, meet them for coffee or ice cream, sometimes tutor, often advise—providing an outlet, an ear, a trusted companion. Corraling the whole spirited gang, kids and mentees, for adventures—to bowl, to visit a pumpkin patch or the zoo—is built into the mission. Getting out is the goal.

For our migrant team families, in this season of well-founded worry, home—an apartment with a strong lock and a security camera—can feel like the lone safe place, a tentative refuge amid escalating enforcement.

For parents, the peril is ubiquitous, as uniformed National Guard officers and non-uniformed ICE agents materialize on sidewalks, in Metro stations, in parks, and at places of employment—a daily menace, a constricting vise. For children, the fear their parents try to disguise is amorphous, not completely understood, but a presence overshadowing the quotidian tasks of growing up: homework and sports, school buses, and gossip, and pals.

Immigrant children have always lived between worlds: quickly fluent in the language and cultural touchstones of their adopted country, guides for their parents at times, required to operate with the balance of tight-rope walker. But the ground below the tight-rope has become more hazardous than ever before, as our government ramps up its action—less flashily than a year ago, but inexorable, and often outside the bounds of even its own callous rules.

Last week, in our cherished migrant family, a mom—supplementing her full-time job with work in a restaurant—heard the shrill, panicked warning: “ICE.” Agents had made their way into the kitchen of the establishment next door—a private space, technically off-limits to warrant-less search, but nonetheless breached. She slipped out and ran the mile to her apartment, falling on the sidewalk, her heart pounding. She has had, for a year, a pending asylum case, a legal protection, but for our quota-driven enforcement apparatus, that has not always been enough.

Increasingly, nationality is grounds for arrest. Among the most vulnerable are, our Haitian families—legally present, pursuing asylum, but nonetheless targets. One Haitian mom of three—newly credentialed in geriatric nursing care—was summoned by ICE and fitted with an ankle monitor, a hindrance to her job search, and an indignity difficult to hide from the world—or from her ebullient, curious children.

Last Sunday, as their children bowled, parents met for an afternoon of social connection and relaxation. Our medical team and parishioner, Roly Diaz, offered stress reduction strategies and a forum for practicing resilience and calm.

In honor of the 112th celebration of World Day of Migrants, Pope Leo chose as theme—and implied

exhortation: “Even just one of these children,” a reference to Matthew 18:5- “*Whoever welcomes even one such child in my name, welcomes me.*”

Throughout our world, an estimated 50 million children are in flight from their homeland, traveling hard roads. In the United States, children languish in family detention longer than the 21 days the law allows. Unaccompanied minors—as young as a year—appear in immigration courts unrepresented, expected to advocate for their right to remain. Children are left behind when their parents are detained—or they are deported along with their parents, to countries where malnutrition is hard to avoid, or gangs lie in wait, eager to extort American deportees for funds they may not have.

For even just one of these children, we grieve.

The corollary is also true. Even just one of these children, jubilant after a bowling ball thuds and careens toward the pins, is a gift. For even just one of these children, smiling radiantly after success, we rejoice.

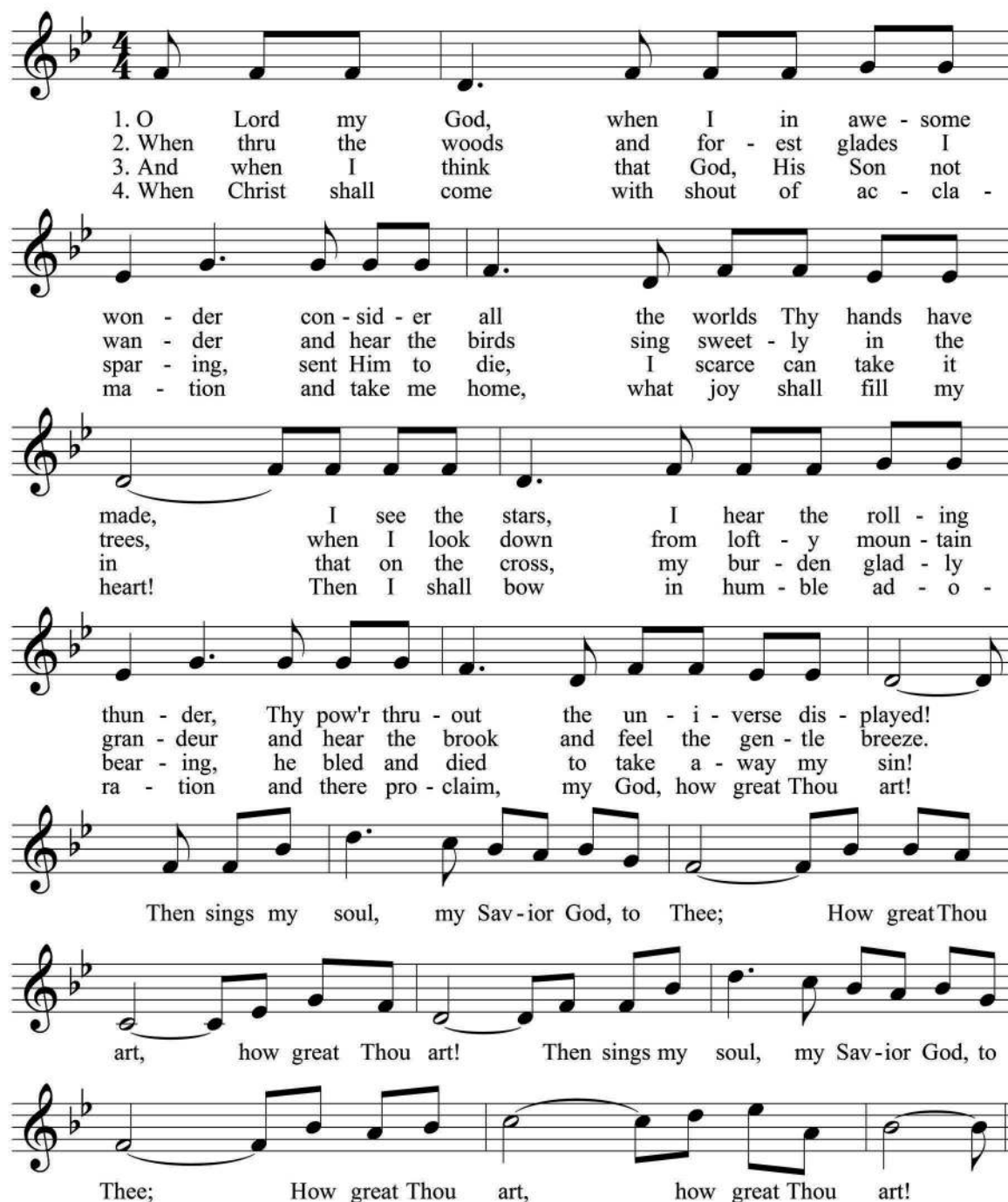

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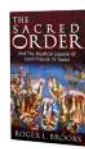


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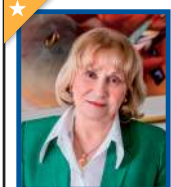
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
